¹The TANF payment standard (PS) is based on the "tier" into which the shelter costs fall: greater than \$50; equal to or less than \$50; or zero. Homeless families get the highest level. Fla. Stat. 414.095(10)

²These figures show the highest income level at which an adult will be eligible for family-related Medicaid coverage assuming that all income is earned and there are no childcare expenses or child support payments. The earned income disregard used is \$200 plus 50% of the remaining income. Note : Parents may still be eligible for Medicaid if their earned income is higher than this amount and they have child care expenses.

³185% of the federal poverty level is also the gross income eligibility standard for TANF. See Fla. Stat. 414.085 (1) (a)

⁴Under Fla. Stat. 445.029 and Federal Medicaid law, if TANF cash assistance or section 1931 Medicaid is terminated due to work income, family is eligible for transitional Medicaid for six months and for an additional six months (2nd six months) so long as their average gross income is within 185% of federal poverty level.

⁵The "family cap" reduces the usual incremental increase in PS per unit size. With a shelter obligation over \$50, the 1st "family cap" child gets \$31 more; with a shelter obligation of \$50 or less, 1st "capped" child gets \$26 more; and with \$0 shelter obligation, 1st "capped" child gets \$24 more. Subsequent "capped" children get no cash. Fla. Stat. 414.115(4), (5).

⁶Income limit for Medicaid for children 19 to 21 living with specified relative or in intact family corresponds to highest TANF PS.
