WHAT IF MY LANDLORD SAYS NO?

- If a landlord says 'No' to your request, seek legal assistance.
 An attorney or advocate can assist you in taking proper action for such violation.
- It is important that you do not move forward with any structural changes or violate any rules or policies prior to approval.

HAVE YOU EVER HEARD:

- "No Pets Allowed." Even though you have a special need for animal companion.
- "Your wheelchair won't make it up these stairs." – Even though a ramp could easily be installed.
- "We are not prepared to accommodate your disability." – Even though you don't even have a disability.

YOU HAVE A RIGHT TO REASONABLE ACCOMMODATIONS & MODIFICATIONS

The federal Fair Housing Act (FHA) protects you from being denied housing when, due to a disability, a reasonable request to modify or accommodate your housing needs are properly made.

WHEN RENTING A LANDLORD MUST:

- Acknowledge requests for reasonable modifications to policies and structures to accommodate a disability.
- Allow tenants to pay for reasonable alterations and reasonably request changes be reverted back to original form.
- Never advertise or limit the showing of a unit in a way that discriminates against a disability.



"We can look into assigning you a closer parking space, but we'll have to charge you an additional fee." "I'm going to have to charge you a pet application fee and deposit for your guide dog."



WHAT IS A DISABILITY:

- Under Fair Housing, a
 disability is any physical or
 mental impairment that
 substantially limits one or
 more major life activities.
- A 'major life activity' would be caring for one's self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning and working.
- Being regarded as having such an impairment also qualifies.
